#### **Elder's Corner**

While walking my dog one morning, I began thinking about the Holy Spirit, and how He works in our lives. I thought about how life could be compared to driving a car down the road, and likened the Holy Spirit to the traffic signals and road signs.

The traffic lights are probably the most important. Red tells us to stop, as it would be dangerous to continue. Green tells us it is safe to proceed. Yellow advises caution. And yet, if we did not look up, we would not see the light at all.

There are many other signs along the road. One shows the speed limit. The limit was established for our protection. Exceeding it can result in injury or loss of life to ourselves or others. Have you ever felt like you were rushing through life? - that in your anxiety to get somewhere or complete a project, you cut a conversation with someone short and failed to hear what they were trying to tell you, leaving them feeling that they don't really matter? Have you been in such a hurry that you were missing the scenery (and getting ulcers, instead)?

Sometimes there is a sign that says, "Caution – Children Playing". Are you careful in how you spend your time? Are you sometimes so occupied with other things that you neglect spending quality time with your family? Sometimes the road, itself, is narrow or dark or filled with potholes. You may not want to go down that road, but once you reach the end, you realize it was necessary in order to reach the desired destination.

Occasionally there is a sign that says "Detour". Do you react with impatience because it will take longer to reach your goal? A road detour occurs when necessary repairs or widened lanes or other improvements are being made to your accustomed route. There is always a reason for it. Perhaps there is always a reason when we don't achieve our goals as quickly as we'd like. Perhaps we should take a closer look at what we perceive as inconveniences. Could they be opportunities? Could the Holy Spirit be trying to gain our attention?

Another sign says "Do Not Enter". Ignoring this sign can lead to disaster. A similar sign says "One Way Only".

When you stop to think about it, traffic signals and road signs truly work to make our lives safer and easier. In order for this to happen, though, we need to be alert as we are driving, and pay attention to all the signs along the way. The same is true of the Holy Spirit. He is always there for us, but we need to be constantly aware of His Presence, and look for and obey His directions.

## **Mission Moment**

#### THE GIDEONS

The Gideons are an association of business and professional men and their member wives. We were organized in 1899, after two commercial travelers met in a hotel in Boscobel Wisconsin. Their initial goal was to band Christian traveling salesmen together to strengthen their walk for Christ. From the beginning Gideons were known for witnessing.

In 1908 they began placing Bibles in hotels. Today, we are organized in 200 countries, territories and possessions and distribute Scriptures in over 100 languages with just one objective: to win men and women, boys and girls to a saving knowledge of Jesus. We place God's Word in designated traffic lanes of life: hotels/motels, schools, colleges and universities, hospitals, jails and the military.

Locally, we go to our schools annually, periodically inspect Bibles in our motel rooms, and are preparing to send 500 Navy camo New Testaments to the sailors on the ships at Mayport. Our two hospitals have Scriptures and the Jacksonville Gideons have a presence at the Duval County Jail.

All Gideons believe the Bible is God's inspired, infallible, inerrant Word.

We must be members of a protestant, evangelical church or assembly and have our pastor's recommendation. We visit churches annually to tell them know how God is using the seeds we are sowing. Since the beginning, Gideons have placed over 2.5 billion Scriptures around the world! The local Gideons are grateful to be included in the missions giving of our church.



## From the Study of Pastor Nathan

Studies on Bible reading in America indicate a range of findings regarding the frequency and depth of engagement with the Bible. Here are some key insights from recent surveys and studies:

- 1. Declining Bible Reading: Several studies have shown a decline in the regular reading of the Bible among Americans. The American Bible Society's "State of the Bible" report in 2020 found that the percentage of Americans who read the Bible at least three to four times a year dropped from 45% in 2019 to 31% in 2020.
- 2. Generation Gap: There is a noticeable generational gap in Bible reading habits. Younger generations tend to read the Bible less frequently than older generations. The same American Bible Society report revealed that only 15% of Millennials reported reading the Bible weekly, compared to 28% of Boomers.
- 3. Varied Motivations: Studies have explored the motivations behind Bible reading. The Barna Group's research found that among Bible readers, the top motivations included personal spiritual growth, seeking answers to life's questions, and gaining a better understanding of God. However, motivations varied across individuals, indicating diverse reasons for engaging with the Bible.
- 4. Bible Engagement Patterns: While the frequency of Bible reading may have declined, there are other forms of Bible engagement that have gained popularity. This includes the use of Bible apps, listening to audio Bibles, participating in Bible studies or small groups, and engaging with Scripture through online platforms or social media.
- 5. Limited Biblical Knowledge: Studies consistently show a decline in biblical literacy and knowledge among Americans. The Pew Research Center's Religious Knowledge Survey in 2019 found that only about one-third of American adults could correctly identify the four Gospels, and less than half could identify the first book of the Bible.
- 6. Digital Bible Access: The rise of digital technology has impacted Bible reading habits. The American Bible Society's "State of the Bible" report in 2020 indicated that 54% of Bible readers reported using a digital device to access the Bible. The convenience and accessibility of digital platforms have made it easier for individuals to engage with Scripture.

It is important to note that while these studies provide valuable insights into Bible reading habits in America, the landscape of religious beliefs and practices is diverse, and individual experiences with the Bible can vary significantly. These findings highlight the need for ongoing efforts to promote biblical literacy, encourage engagement with the Bible, and provide resources and support for individuals to deepen their understanding of Scripture.

Ownership God is the owner of all things. "The earth is the Lord's, and all it contains, the world, and those who dwell in it" (Ps. 24:1). We come into the world with nothing and leave it with nothing (Job 1:21; 1 Tim. 6:7), but God says, "every beast of the forest is Mine, the cattle on a thousand hills. I know every bird of the mountains, and everything that moves in the field is Mine" (Ps. 50:10-11). Everything we have, therefore, comes from Him (John 3:27; Jas. 1:17). There is no such thing as a "self-made man"--"What do you have that you did not receive? But if you did receive it, why do you boast as if you had not received it?" (1 Cor. 4:7). We may believe this truth in theory but deny it in practice. When this happens, we slip into the rebellious attitude that "My power and the strength of my hand made me this wealth" (Deut. 8:17). Instead, we must come to grips with the fact that everything we have in this world belongs to God and is only "on loan" to us. This includes not only our money and possessions, but also our families, careers, and plans for the future. If we can get straight on the principle of 100% ownership, we will be ready for the principle of 100% stewardship. Some areas of our lives are harder to yield to God than others. For many Christians, the financial area is one of the hardest.
