Simple Benefits for Everyday Life





Paul appeals to our Christian responsibility to help those in need. In this passage, he details the side effects of generosity. Giving enriches and benefits the giver as well as the recipient. A gift can be an act of worship to God and inspire other people's faith and thanksgiving. FCCB continues to be committed to sharing 10% of each month's undesignated tithes and offerings here in our Beaches community, in Jacksonville, nationally, and internationally. Input from FCCB members (contact me if you have a suggestion), church leadership, and the direction of the Holy Spirit guide the decisions made by the Missions Team to disburse these funds.

We give a regular monthly amount to the ministries listed below. Our regular giving helps these ministries to plan their work and usually represents a tithe of about half of the monthly amount received in undesignated tithes and offerings.

FCCB gives on a regular basis to the following organizations:

Anchor Academy Pantry, ARC of the St. Johns, Beaches Emergency Assistance Ministry (BEAM), Beaches Community Kitchen, Child Fund International support of Jenesis, the young girl we sponsor, Dial-A-Ride, Disciple Heritage Fellowship, Fellowship of Christian Athletes, First Coast Women's Services, Florida Christian Center, Foreign Missions, Gideons International, Mission House, Seniors on a Mission, Sulzbacher Clinic-Beaches, Beaches Healthcare, among others.

Anything received beyond the amount needed to make these regular monthly gifts becomes Discretionary Missions dollars and is used for special gifts to meet particular needs such as:

Back to School with BEAM, Disaster Relief through Disciples Week of Compassion, Individual Needs (FCCB members and community neighbors), Love Packages postage, Neptune Beach Police No More Empty Stockings Fund, and Samaritan's Purse/Operation Christmas Child

FCCB, in coordination with Mission House and other local churches, will provide an overnight shelter, hot meals, and fellowship for our local homeless people on cold nights (Below 40°F). In addition, our church will provide a COMPASSION NIGHT SHELTER every 4 months REGARDLESS of the weather.

On Friday, 12 April 2024, FCCB will be hosting a COMPASSION NIGHT SHELTER starting at 5pm and ending 8am, 13 April. We need shift volunteers to set up the event, to be greeters, food servers, guest monitors, and to help clean up. A donation list of items is available by scanning the QR Code above. Needed supplies include bottled water, juice, milk, sandwiches, food gift cards, etc.

Shifts will normally be 3 hours long. There will ALWAYS be at least two experienced shelter workers on site during the event. They will aid, oversee, train, and support shelter volunteers. Serve God Not Money

We must choose where our ultimate loyalty will lie; Jesus' contrast between earthly and heavenly treasures and masters is too sharp to allow compromise. "No servant can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one, and love the other, or else he will hold to one, and despise the other. You cannot serve God and money." (Luke 16:13).

Haddon Robinson put the issue in these terms: Either we serve God and use money or we serve money and use God. Yet, few Christians deliberately dedicate their lives to materialism. Wealth is deceitful, Jesus told us, and its bondage is subtle. Like the flypaper and the fly, the fly lands on the sticky substance thinking "my flypaper" only to discover that the flypaper says "my fly."

Our wealth depends not so much on what we have, but on what we can do without. We can cling so hard to possessions that they won't let us go. One of the qualifications for both elders and deacons is that they be "free from the love of money" and not "fond of sordid gain" (1 Tim. 3:3,8). God wants us to love people and use things. Too often we use people and love things. We do not own the things we cannot give away--they own us.


New Women's Christian Book Study
